on this idea take a more holistic approach as they consider arts, therapies, alternate medicine, nutrition and current science etc., in order to provide more meaningful life to special children and adults. Similar models of living communities for special persons are active throughout the world.

# Focus on Living Community

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As Roshni Association's main purpose is to provide an alternate home to special persons, the organization has now decided to focus more on the living community and limit the day care services. The decision was taken to make sure our students get most out of the living facility we provide. Day care services were being provided to special adults since 2001. In the last few years, as the number of students for the facility increased, the organization felt that the students needed more attention. Presently they spend a lot of time in the vans during their long journeys from their homes to Roshni and back.

Finally, after months of discussion and planning, it was decided to execute the plan of focussing on the living community. A General Body Meeting was held on 3rd May 2014 to officially announce and explain this plan to members and friends of Roshni Association.

The students from day care will be given priority to move into our living community and for the rest Roshni will help them in beina accommodated the in other institutions of Lahore which provide good vocational training services to special persons. We hope that friends of Roshni will support us in our decision taken for the students' welfare.

It was founded by Ms. Shahida Perveen and her husband Mr. Hamid Hannesen to combine the meeting of East and West with an appropriate perspective of people with disabilities and special needs.

The primary goal of Roshni Association is to nurture healthy development of special persons while providing a stable environment in calm surroundings. It teaches meaningful skills to them in its Woodwork Workshop, Textile Workshop, Arts & Crafts Workshop, Organic Bakery and Organic Gardens. By presenting their work and selling their workshop products, they feel self confident and appreciate being recognized by the society. Our special persons reside in the living comunity which comprises of Roshni House and Sumbal House. A firm emphasis on the balance of work both, indoors and outdoors as well as sports, arts, and cultural activities, provides a fulfilling mixture for students and volunteers alike.

Green Earth Roshni School (GERS) is the second big pillar of Roshni Association. GERS was launched in 2005 in a joint effort by Roshni Association and Mr. Zafar Bhatti (CEO, Green Earth Recycling, Pakistan). It is the only school in Pakistan providing Waldorf education to around 140 local students from kindergarten to grade 8. The Waldorf system aims to provide education with sensitivity and a deep understanding of the children and their needs.

In the last 13 years Roshni Association has welcomed more than 100 local and foreign volunteers. Besides working in our two projects, the volunteers from Germany and other foreign countries, have had the opportunity to understand our religion, culture, language and traditions. Such interaction helps to bridge the gap between East and West, which is so important, especially in the context of the present situation.
